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### *Message from our Interim Rector*

Dear Friends—

When I first wrote my column for this month's newsletter, it was about the joy of preparing to begin a new church year on September 18<sup>th</sup>. But then, of course, along came Irene, and now we have other things on our minds. Here in St. John's, many of you lost power and water and phone service, some lost property, a few are still stranded as I write, unable to leave the towns they live in. Most of us know people who have lost their homes and livelihoods; all of us have seen just about all the pictures and videos of devastation and destruction we can stomach.

Offers of help are coming in from all over – the diocese, the national Episcopal Church, Episcopal Relief and Development, which is the Episcopal Church's international aid organization. And we will all have opportunities to pitch in and help others as things begin to settle down. Here are some first steps the diocese has suggested to begin the long-term way forward:

1. Pray for all who have been affected by the floods and for all those who are providing aid, assistance, and relief.

2. **Appoint/find a point person from your church community who can be liaison to the diocese as response moves forward over the next few weeks and as more information comes in.**
3. **Actual people-power may not be needed for a couple of weeks; communities need time first for the FEMA and Nat'l Guard heavy equipment to do the preliminary work and then withdraw leaving LOTS of work for many hands. Ask for people who are able and willing to help with hands-on work to identify themselves and create a list to pass along to the diocese.**
4. **The diocese is working with many experienced people on response, including from ER-D and the Diocese of Massachusetts (both of which were very involved in Katrina response) to put together a more coordinated response. More information will be coming over the next couple of weeks.**
5. **In the meantime, it would be helpful for us to start collecting money that can be converted to gift cards for places like Home Depot, Aubuchons, Wal-Mart, Shaw's, Staples, Walgreens, etc. Once we have collected money over a two or three Sunday period, we can purchase these cards and connect with Lynn for distribution or send contributions that can be distributed through local congregations as vouchers for local, independently-owned businesses.**

**The most significant damage to church buildings in our diocese was sustained by Gethsemane Church in Proctorsville, where the parish hall lies in unsalvageable ruins and the church itself slipped off its foundation. The congregation will meet to outline their plan for responding to the needs of their community and will be calling upon other Episcopal congregations to support them in their efforts.**

**Representatives from Episcopal Relief and Development will meet with the clergy of the diocese at a meeting here at St. John's later this month. So if you or someone you know needs help, please be sure to let us know.**

**And, as I was saying before the hurricane so rudely interrupted me, we will be celebrating the start of a new program year together on September 18<sup>th</sup> with, among other things, a potluck meal after church, which will move back to its regular 10 o'clock timeslot. More on the new year in October newsletter; meanwhile, please join us.**
